



The Rio Grande do Sul Youth Ambassador's Program

Programa de Jovens Embaixadores

How does the program work?

- Caring Indiana families host a Brazilian teen, ages 15 to 18, like a family member.
- Host families must be committed to integrating the Brazilian student into normal family activities.
- Youth Ambassadors need to participate in school regularly or in a home school program, not for credit, but are expected to participate in classes and activities.
- Youth Ambassadors are also expected to perform some type of volunteer service; Indiana Youth Ambassador Coordinators with Partners will help with ideas.
- Family sightseeing excursions are encouraged.
- Indiana Partners provides an Indy Capital City Weekend. Other excursions may be arranged with families.

What does a host family provide?

- A single or shared room and family meals.
- Transportation to and from the airport, school, and sponsored activities.
- Inclusion in family activities and excursions.
- Facilitate volunteer activities.
- Students will bring spending money, health insurance, school transcripts and medical records.

How long does the student stay?

Eight weeks, from the first week in January to the first week in March (during Brazilian summer vacation). Specific dates change each year depending on holidays and flight availability.
